Remote Teaching Lesson plan with Links



Develop a lesson plan for remote learning during synchronous teaching



Use a basic lesson plan format



Add links for the various parts of the lesson to engage students and organize your teaching elements



Remote Teaching Lesson plan with Links



Get any lesson plan template and make it your own.



Use any app you are comfortable with to create lesson content



Save with the appropriate name and dress it up if you want (Format>table>table properties)



Use plan to direct your teaching online



Review content in the sample plan and add a link or create a plan from the template and add all of the links

Multimedia Text Sets

- An inquiry-based lesson set filled with multimedia links based on a theme to encourage students (mostly) independent learning
- An evolution of Library “Text Set” based on a theme
- Develop one-page lesson (or a few pages) for students to work on independently
- Use a variety of templates based on your topic.

Hyperdocs



The next step in Multimedia Text Sets to replace worksheets with authentic learning using a digital, scaffolding system and a variety of basic apps, such as Google Docs, to house the scaffold.



For us: develop one-page lesson (or a few pages) for students to work on independently in a scaffold format, building on each previous layer although they don't need to be completely independent.



Use a variety of templates based on your topic.



Add links for the various parts of the lesson to engage students



Use any app you are comfortable with to create lesson content

Hyperdocs: Modify Template: Step-by-Step

- [Hyperdocs](#) Start> review explanation – 4 C’s critical thinking, communication, collaboration, and creativity. And is a transformative Google Doc (or other document) for blended or remote learning. Hyperdocs incorporates the idea from Current Ed Tech standards (ISTE, TCEA) of the focus being on teaching not technology.
